• Hart InterCivic – Michael Choate, Certification Project Manager – Certification request for approval of de minimis change to Verity 2.5.

Michael Choate gave a presentation requesting approval of de minimis changes to Verity 2.5. (See attached presentation given.)

Commissioner McDonald made a motion to approve Verity 2.5 de minimis changes, seconded by Commissioner Duckett.

- Review Candidate(s) Names in Accordance with TCA § 2-5-204 (c)
 - Robby Starbuck Newson Requested name to appear on ballot as Robby Starbuck.

Coordinator Goins briefed the commission on the requirement of candidates being listed on the ballot by their surname. Robby Starbuck Newsom wants his name to appear on the ballot as Robby Starbuck. Mr. Newsom's voter registration and Tennessee Driver's License show his legal name as Robert Starbuck Newsom. Coordinator Goins advised commission members they need to determine if Mr. Newsome's name would be misleading or confusing if he appeared on the ballot as Robby Starbuck.

Mr. Newsom spoke before the commission and provided handouts as to why he should appear on the ballot as Robby Starbuck. Mr. Newsom advised the commission he is known as Robby Starbuck with family, friends, and the public. Mr. Newsom stated on all legal documents he uses Robert Starbuck Newsom. Mr. Newsom has investigated getting his name legally changed, but the name would not be changed before the November election. (See attached documents provided by Mr. Newsom.)

Commissioner Duckett made a motion that Mr. Newsom's name, as submitted on his petition, would be misleading and confusing, should his name appear on the ballot that his surname Newsom should be included on the ballot, seconded by Commissioner Barrett.

• County Election Commission Residency Qualifications

Chairman Blackburn discussed a recent county election commission appointment she made where the appointee did not meet residency requirements.

Coordinator Goins advised commission members one other commission member has been identified as not meeting residency requirements prior to appointment, and the appointee had voted in another state. Coordinator Goins suggested residency should be confirmed with the appointee and that it is his opinion this person is not eligible to serve on the county election commission.

• Election of Chairman for the term of May 1, 2022, through April 30, 2023

A motion was made by Commissioner Barrett and seconded by Commissioner McDonald to elect Kent Younce as Chairman of the State Election Commission. (Aye votes: Barrett, Blackburn, Duckett, Eldridge, McDonald, Wheeler and Younce; No votes: None; Abstention: None.)

• Election of Secretary for the term of May 1, 2022, through April 30, 2023

A motion was made by Commissioner Wheeler and seconded by Commissioner McDonald to elect Greg Duckett as Secretary of the State Election Commission. (Aye votes: Barrett, Blackburn, Duckett, Eldridge, McDonald, Wheeler and Younce; No votes: None; Abstention: None.)

Coordinator Update

- Coordinator Goins discussed recent legislation requiring congressional candidates to have voted in three (3) previous statewide general elections prior to being nominated as a candidate for election. The Governor did not sign this piece of legislation prior to the qualifying deadline. Coordinator Goins stated if there were a residency challenge for congressional office, the State Election Commission would hold the hearing to determine residency.
- Coordinator Goins stated a trial court moved the Senate qualifying deadline to May 5, 2022. The Supreme Court has agreed to hear the case.
- Coordinator Goins discussed legislation regarding a paper audit trail. Fifteen
 million has been appropriated to the supplemental budget, which will be
 applied to HAVA funds, for counties to use to buy machines that meet the
 requirement for a voter verified paper audit trail. Implementation would be
 required by 2024, unless a hardship is provided by a county.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:06 p.m. Central Time.

The next scheduled meeting is set for July 11, 2022, and will be held in the William R. Snodgrass – Tennessee Tower, Nashville Room - 3rd floor at 12:00 Noon, Central Standard Time.

PROCEDURES FOR CERTIFYING VOTING MACHINES BY THE TENNESSEE STATE ELECTION COMMISSION

All voting machines/vendors must receive certification from the state election commission and the coordinator of elections before any voting machines or systems may be sold in the State of Tennessee.

First Step:

Any interested vendor should submit a written request to the coordinator of elections and the state election commission requesting certification of your company together with the EAC certification number, a financial report and a list of all states that have already bought your voting machines or systems. If you would like to demonstrate your product at a meeting of the state election commission, please make that request in your letter. You will be notified of the date, time, and place of the meeting where you may make your presentation.

Second Step:

A. Voting Machine Procedure

Following verification of EAC certification and an initial presentation of your product and/or services, you would need to arrange for at least two (2) State Election Commissioners (of opposite parties) and the coordinator of elections (or designee) to view your machines or system in use in an election of a substantial size in another state. An election of a substantial size involves at the minimum the following characteristics:

- The jurisdiction has a population of at least 10,000 persons;
- The jurisdiction has at least two (2) or more district races on the ballots; and
- There are at least two (2) contested races involving both at large and district races on the ballot.

B. Voting Machine Software or Hardware Upgrade

- EAC Certification;
- Presentation of upgrade before State Election Commission at a meeting; and
- Viewing of upgrade in another state (In lieu of viewing machine in another state, at the discretion of the State Election Commission, letters of recommendation from users in other jurisdiction may be used as support for approval.)

C. De Minimis Voting System Changes

Any De Minimis change to an EAC certified voting system shall be submitted to the state election commission and
coordinator of elections to be approved. For purposes of approval of the de minimis change to the voting system,
all that will be required is a letter from the EAC stating the change is de minimis, unless further information is
requested by the state election commission or coordinator of elections.

Third Step:

The State Election Commission must vote to certify the machine in order for the machines to be used in an election in Tennessee.



3.2 Impacted Device Images

All Verity device images will be updated to enable the creation of the pagefile.sys system file.

- Updated CFast cards are provided. All CFasts are labeled with "ECO-01461".
- There is no impact to the Base OS master image CFast, as the paging file is now made during the creation of each Verity device image.

• There is no change to the Verity device software and there will be no change to the hash validation. The device hash files have been provided in the attached archive: 4005689A_Supporting_Documents.zip.

1 SUMMARY

This ECO makes several clarifying clerical updates and adds an additional construction method for an existing internal device cable. There are no changes to the production Verity device assemblies.

The following changes are made in this ECO:

- Clerical Verity Duo series baseboards correction. A duplicate reference designator is removed.
- Three cable drawings are updated to clarify that any connector tooling points are to be covered.

2 REASON / JUSTIFICATION FOR CHANGE

The changes described in this ECO are primarily clerical in nature to ensure manufacturing documentation is unambiguous and clear. Additional ECO changes are to mitigate long lead times.

3 DESCRIPTIONS OF CHANGES

3.1 Duo Baseboard Clerical BOM Correction

A reference designator, C121, that determines the installation location of a capacitor component is erroneously listed on two different item numbers on Verity Duo series baseboards. This ECO removes C121 from Item 1005464 on the following BOMs:

3.2 Cable Drawing Overmold Clarification

The cable assembly drawings described in this section have been updated to clarify that tooling points, "pinhole" artifacts due to the connector overmold application process, shall be covered on the completed cable assembly.

3.3 Cable Alternate Construction

Cable 2005407 is an internal ribbon cable used to connect the thermal report printer to the Verity device baseboard, where thermal report printers are used. This change adds an alternate construction method to have the Hart CM purchase and assembly the ribbon cable and connectors, rather than purchase as a completed assembly.

A new cable assembly part is created as 2005798, which is then added as an alternate to the 2005407 AML. The Hart controlled specifications do not change, so the cable assembly assembled by the Hart CM is identical to prior revisions and was validated in manufacturing level testing described in section 3.3.1.



3.3.1 Testing Data and Processes


The following processes were performed on an initial sample of 10 Hart CM built cables and all processes will be repeated to validate 100% of all cables assembled.

The cables were immediately validated after assembly by the Hart CM using a purpose-built test fixture to validate that all 26 wires make good contact with no open or short circuits, as shown below.




The cables were then installed into Verity devices equipped with Manufacturing Testing Utilities. The utilities are used to validate that all hardware in a manufactured Verity device is functional.

The thermal report printer was first tested to be functional with the supplied cable by running a 5-line print test:



An 8-hour burn-in test was then performed that continually operates the hardware on the device including the thermal report printer.

All sample cables built by the Hart CM passed testing successfully.





On nonpartisan general election ballots and on the political party's primary ballot, the names of all candidates for the same office shall be arranged alphabetically according to the initials of their surnames, beginning with the first initial.

Not including your legal surname of Newsom on the ballot may be considered confusing or misleading.

The U.S. Constitution does not require candidates to live in the congressional district of the seat they're seeking. Starbuck said he intends to purchase another home in Nashville.

In politics: Tennessee Supreme Court hears arguments in fight over state's controversial school voucher program

"I'm in Nashville pretty much every day," said Starbuck, who believes his Cuban heritage and plans to campaign in areas of the city previously neglected by Republicans will provide inroads with Latino residents and other minorities in the district.

"I have an opportunity to connect with groups of people that traditionally have not felt outreach," Starbuck said, noting success Republicans in 2020 found with reaching immigrants in South Florida and South Texas.

His mother and grandparents left Cuba for the United States in the 1960s, he said.

Starbuck, who is active online and boasts 188,000 followers on Twitter, has made opposition socialism part of his campaign platform, as well as other recent hot-button conservative issues like critical race theory. He said he faced pushback after he "came out as a Republican"

in Hollywood and began posting on social media about his beliefs in 2015, though Starbuck has managed to build a sizable following of online conservatives.

Cooper has represented the majority Democratic district since 2002.

"I think it's a fight worth having," Starbuck said of his decision to run in the district. "In Tennessee, we're also seeing a migration of people leaving states that are failing and are ready for change in their own lives. Some of whom have voted Democrat their entire lives."

The GOP hasn't cracked 40% of the district's vote in the general election since 2010, when David Hall ran against Cooper.

Republican Quincy McKnight has also announced a run for the seat, while Democrat Odessa Kelly's campaign is underway to challenge Cooper from the left.

The district could be altered when congressional maps are re-drawn and re-approved by the state legislature at the beginning of 2022, however.

"I know the one thing people are going to say about me is 'His house isn't here,'" Starbuck said. "Jim Cooper's house may not be in the new district either.

"It's very possible my farm could end up in the district and his house could not end up in the district."

Starbuck said he has not aware of what Tennessee Republicans' plans are for re-drawing the district and has "no interest in meddling about what it will be."

Republican leaders haven't publicly ruled out dividing Nashville into multiple congressional districts, something that was discussed a decade ago but did not occur.

A former director and producer of music videos and commercials, Starbuck said he currently is an investor in real estate and the stock market.

He said if the race calls for it, Starbuck is prepared to personally loan his campaign money.

two. It started when they found each other online, and Paul has appeared on Starbuck's online show.

In a video shared by Starbuck, who does not have a campaign staff and said he has no immediate plans to hire a consultant or manager, Paul said Starbuck would vote for limited Jvernment and against "endless wars."

"I don't endorse many people for Congress, but i'm endorsing Robby Starbuck because he's one of the good guys," said Paul, who also backed Manny Sethi in his unsuccessful Republican primary bid last year against Bill Hagerty for U.S. Senate.

Starbuck, whose legal name is Robby Newsom, said he is currently in talks with his lawyer about whether he will need to legally change his last name to appear as Starbuck, his middle name, on the ballot.

He joked that he has "no relation" to California Gov. Gavin Newsom, a Democrat. Starbuck and his family moved to the state from Calabasas after wanting to live in an area with people more closely aligned with their values.

His wife, Landon Newsom, is a musician who performs under the name Matriarch and is also outspoken online about conservative issues. The couple has three children.

County Election Commission Residency Qualifications

Tenn. Code Ann. § 2-12-102

2-12-102. Qualifications of commissioners.

- (a)(1) Except as provided in subdivision (a)(2), persons appointed to the county election commission shall be registered voters who have been residents of the state for five (5) years and residents of the county for which they are appointed for two (2) years.
- (2) In counties having a population of not less than two hundred seventy-six thousand (276,000) nor more than two hundred seventy-seven thousand (277,000), according to the 1970 federal census or any subsequent federal census, the persons appointed to the county election commission shall be registered voters who have been residents of the county for which they are appointed for two (2) years.
- (b)(1) A county election commissioner who qualifies as a candidate for any public office while serving as a commissioner is automatically disqualified to continue in office as a commissioner, and a vacancy exists on the commission.
- (2) If an immediate family member of a county election commissioner is on the ballot for public office in the county in which the commissioner serves, the commissioner must:
- (A) Abstain from voting on any issues that directly affect the commissioner's immediate family member; and
- **(B)** Be recused from the official duties of the commission at least thirty (30) days before the election and the state election commission shall appoint a temporary replacement for the election. The recused county election commissioner is reinstated to the office after the election in question is certified.
- (3) As used in this subsection (b), "immediate family member" means a spouse, parent, sibling, or child.
- (c) A person employed as an assistant public defender or an assistant district attorney may serve as a county election commissioner if such assistant public defender or assistant district attorney does not work in the district in which such assistant public defender or assistant district attorney lives.
- (d) Subsection (c) shall not apply in any county having a population of not less than eight hundred ninety-seven thousand four hundred (897,400) nor more than eight hundred ninety-seven thousand five hundred (897,500), according to the 2000 federal census or any subsequent federal census.
