PROCEDURES FOR CERTIFYING VOTING MACHINES BY THE TENNESSEE STATE ELECTION COMMISSION

All voting machines/vendors must receive certification from the state election commission and the coordinator of elections before any voting machines or systems may be sold in the State of Tennessee.

First Step.

Any interested vendor should submit a written request to the coordinator of elections and the state election commission requesting certification of your company together with the EAC certification number, a financial report and a list of all states that have already bought your voting machines or systems. If you would like to demonstrate your product at a meeting of the state election commission, please make that request in your letter. You will be notified of the date, time, and place of the meeting where you may make your presentation.

Second Step

A. Voting Machine Procedure

Following verification of EAC certification and an initial presentation of your product and/or services, you would need to arrange for at least two (2) State Election Commissioners (of opposite parties) and the coordinator of elections (or designee) to view your machines or system in use in an election of a substantial size in another state. An election of a substantial size involves at the minimum the following characteristics:

- The jurisdiction has a population of at least 10,000 persons;
- The jurisdiction has at least two (2) or more district races on the ballots; and
- There are at least two (2) contested races involving both at large and district races on the ballot.

B. Voting Machine Software or Hardware Upgrade

- EAC Certification;
- Presentation of upgrade before State Election Commission at a meeting; and
- Viewing of upgrade in another state (In lieu of viewing machine in another state, at the discretion of the State Election Commission, letters of recommendation from users in other jurisdiction may be used as support for approval.)

C. De Minimis Voting System Changes

Any De Minimis change to an EAC certified voting system shall be submitted to the state election commission and
coordinator of elections to be approved. For purposes of approval of the de minimis change to the voting system,
all that will be required is a letter from the EAC stating the change is de minimis, unless further information is
requested by the state election commission or coordinator of elections.


Third Step:

The State Election Commission must vote to certify the machine in order for the machines to be used in an election in Tennessee.

This OVO modification addresses the following field issue detected on the OVO module of the OpenElect version 2.2: It was observed that when "Close" cards are used to initiate the close session process on the OVO that when the "Close" card was returned to the operator, the scanner was not disabled. This opened the possibility for the "Close" card to be entered a second time and the potential of starting a second close process. Depending on the timing of these processes, if they occur concurrently (as opposed to sequentially) the close session process will generate a report which shows doubled vote counts and produces a tally.xml file that cannot be uploaded into the central tabulation system. This change will disable the scanner after the "Close" card is returned, preventing the opportunity of creating a secondary close session process. To address the issue, Unisyn is recommending two changes in ReaderClient.java in a single method: processData(). The first change is the addition of a single line of code that sets an existing system flag that tells the OVO to leave the scanner disabled after the current document is ejected. The second change is the addition of a single line of code that re-enables the scanner in the event that the operator does not confirm the start of the close process, so that the voting session can continue.

Pro V&V reviewed and sampled Unisyn-submitted test cases for functional testing. Pro V&V modified the submitted test cases as needed to efficiently analyze the changes to the system. Based on testing performed, Pro V&V determined the change did not adversely affect the system functionality, performance, accessibility, usability, safety, or security of the system. The system tested was verified to be accurate during testing with the actual results matching the expected results. No issues were encountered during testing.

The Source Code Review was performed by doing a manual comparison review using ExamDiffPro software. The previously certified source code (version 2.2) was used as the baseline for the comparison against the newly updated source code with the fix incorporated (version 2.2.1). Pro V&V verified the only changes that were made to the newly submitted source code were the two single line code additions and updating the version number.

Pro V&V determined the modification was successfully implemented and no additional testing is required.

This recommendation is based on the software change having the following general characteristics: (1) Update a discrete component of the system and do not impact overall system functionality; (2) Do not modify the counting or tally logic of a component or the system (formatting changes to reports are allowable); (3) Do not affect the accuracy of the component or system; (4) Do not negatively impact the functionality, performance, accessibility, usability, safety, or security of a component or system; (5) Do not alter the overall configuration of the certified system; and (6) Can be reviewed and/or tested by VSTL personnel in a short amount of time (approximately less than 100 hours).

Overview:

This OVO modification addresses the possibility of inserting a ballot during the transition to jammed ballot handling on the OVO. This introduces a potential race condition that can result in a cast ballot being returned to the user.

This proposal encompasses minor changes to 6 files, extending the implementation of methods that remove and restore the reference to the module that accepts ballot data in the event of jam error code from the scanner and restoring it when the jam condition is no longer active. Per Unisyn, this was originally implemented in the AbstractReaderClient.java file but was reimplemented as two methods in ReaderDriver.java (hideReadListener() and restoreReaderListener()) so that it could be used by multiple modules. An additional flag and delay were added to ensure that no data is sent from the scanner to the software while the jam is being handled.

Engineering Recommendation:

Pro V&V utilized NOC 19-01 during the ECO review. Source Code Review, Technical Documentation Review, Functional Testing and Accuracy Test performed by Pro V&V for final recommendation. Pro V&V reviewed and sampled Unisyn-submitted test cases for functional testing. Accuracy Testing was performed utilizing each supported ballot size.

Based on testing performed, Pro V&V determined the change did not adversely affect the system functionality, performance, accessibility, usability, safety, or security of the system. The system tested was verified to be accurate during testing with the actual results matching the expected results. No issues were encountered during testing.

The Source Code Review was performed by doing a manual comparison review using ExamDiffPro software. The previously certified source code (version 2.2.1) was used as the baseline for the comparison against the newly updated source code with the fix incorporated (version 2.2.2). Pro V&V verified the only changes made to the newly submitted source code were the minor changes to six files, as described in the submitted supporting documentation, and updating the version number.

Pro V&V determined the modification was successfully implemented and no additional testing is required. Pro V&V determined the modification successfully addressed the issue.

This recommendation is based on the software change having the following general characteristics: (1) Update a discrete component of the system and do not impact overall system functionality; (2) Do not modify the counting or tally logic of a component or the system (formatting changes to reports are allowable); (3) Do not affect the accuracy of the component or system; (4) Do not negatively impact the functionality, performance, accessibility, usability, safety, or security of a component or system; (5) Do not alter the overall configuration of the certified system; and (6) Can be reviewed and/or tested by VSTL personnel in a short amount of time (approximately less than 100 hours).

All test artifacts (revised code, generated hash values of source code and trusted builds, and as-run test cases) were submitted to the EAC for review along with this ECO Analysis.


