Eligibility of Blind and Other Physically Disabled Persons for Loan of Library Materials

The following persons are eligible for service provided they are residents of the United States, including territories, insular possessions, the District of Columbia, and American citizens living abroad.

- 1. Blind persons whose visual acuity, as determined by competent authority, is 20/200 or less in the better eye with correcting lenses, or whose widest diameter of visual field subtends an angular distance no greater than 20 degrees.
- 2. Other physically disabled persons are eligible as follows:
 - A. Persons whose visual disability, with correction and regardless of optical measurement, is certified by competent authority as preventing the reading of regular printed material.
 - B. Persons certified by competent authority as unable to read or unable to use regular printed material because of physical limitations.
 - C. Persons certified by competent authority as having a reading disability resulting from organic dysfunction and of sufficient severity to prevent reading regular printed material in a conventional manner.

Certifying Authority

Certifying authorities include doctors of medicine; doctors of osteopathy; ophthalmologists; optometrists; registered nurses; therapists; and professional staff of hospitals, institutions, and public or private welfare agencies (e.g., social workers, case workers, counselors, rehabilitation teachers, and superintendents). In the absence of any of these, certification may be made by professional librarians or by any person whose competence under specific circumstances is acceptable to the Library of Congress.
