PARDON

TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, on September 11, 2006, in the Criminal Court of Perry County, Tennessee, Michael Neil Graham (TOMIS #410863) was convicted of eight counts of forgery, two counts of simple possession and unlawful drug paraphernalia (case nos. 940 and 4333) and was sentenced to four years of Community Corrections; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

WHEREAS, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive clemency for the following reasons:


Mr. Graham has worked as a logistics manager since 2012 and is an avid outdoorsman who enjoys spending time with his wife and children. He has been sober for over 14 years. Many members of the community, including law enforcement and municipal leaders, testify to his extraordinary change. The Tennessee Board of Parole recommended pardoning Mr. Graham.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6 of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Michael Graham, pardoning him for his 2006 convictions.
