PARDON

TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, on April 3, 2009, in the Criminal Court of Bradley County, Tennessee, Quantel D. Lindsey (TOMIS #457879) was convicted of robbery (case no. 08-619) and sentenced to four years; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

WHEREAS, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive clemency for the following reasons:

Since his conviction, Mr. Lindsey has become active in his community. He is involved with nonprofits in Bradley County, volunteers at the juvenile detention center, and serves on the local foster care board. He has been on staff at two churches and currently serves as a youth pastor. He has significant public support, and proponents of clemency include multiple pastors, church staff, community members, and friends. Bishop Kevin Wallace described Mr. Lindsey's calm demeanor, transformation, and commitment to God. The Tennessee Board of Parole recommended pardoning Mr. Lindsey.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6 of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Quantel D. Lindsey, pardoning him for his 2009 conviction of robbery.
