**PARDON**

**TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:**

**WHEREAS**, in June of 1997, in the Criminal Court for Hamilton County, Tennessee, Jasbir Singh Mann received a 48-hour workhouse sentence, a \$360 fine, and the loss of his license for driving under the influence (case no. 216122); and

**WHEREAS**, Tennessee's constitution and statutory law authorize the governor to grant executive clemency, including the power to issue pardons; and

**WHEREAS**, this case appears to me to be a proper one for the exercise of executive clemency for the following reasons:

Mr. Mann made one mistake as a young person, took responsibility for it, and has had a clean record and demonstrated exemplary citizenship for over twenty years. Various clemency supporters discussed Mr. Mann's exemplary citizenship, courteous nature, dependability, trustworthiness, responsibility, and other positive character traits. Mr. Mann is a college graduate gainfully employed in the media industry. The Tennessee Board of Parole recommended pardoning Mr. Mann.

**NOW THEREFORE**, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 6 of the Tennessee Constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby grant a pardon in favor of Jasbir Singh Mann, pardoning him for his 1997 conviction of driving under the influence.
